With 16 offices across North Carolina, the SBTDC serves all 100 counties.

Disaster Recovery

The SBTDC is a designated "first responder" for business recovery in the state's disaster recovery plan.

Since Hurricane Floyd in 1999, we have provided post-disaster counseling and assisted businesses in securing federal and state disaster loans to support their recovery. In addition to our self-service resources, such as the *Disaster Recovery Guide*, our disaster-experienced counselors offer one-on-one assistance to businesses in declared disaster areas.

Carolina Therapy Connection Greenville, NC

Cindy Taylor, owner of Carolina Therapy Connection, felt like her business was a train she'd been running behind: "I didn't know how we compared to other businesses," she said. The SBTDC helped her develop HR policies and strategies for scaling. With their guidance, she shifted her focus from opening new locations to expanding services in her existing offices, leading to a more engaged staff and higher client satisfaction.



Local Roots & Provisions

Lincolnton, NC

Local Roots and Provisions encountered the SBTDC early in their development phase. "The biggest thing that they helped us with was the financial plan," Ethan Herman explained. Their counselor also advised them on staffing and connected them with a banker and a marketing group. Her experience working with restaurants helped fill in the group's knowledge gaps.



Core Tech Molding Greensboro, NC

With support from the SBTDC, Geoff Foster, founder of Core Tech Molding, received a funding match for his internship program, enabling the company to attract top talent. SBTDC also helped him expand into government contracting and international business through connections to resources and industry partners. As a result, his company saw triple-digit growth on the top line and four-digit growth on the bottom line.

Winston-Salem, NC

Liyu Nalven and her husband, Gary, started LinorTek in 2012, focusing on niche products like a wireless school bell system. With the SBTDC's guidance, they expanded into Canada and other international markets. Over the years, LinorTek has grown by 30% annually, securing Fortune 500 clients and winning the SBA's NC Small Business Exporter of the Year award in 2024. Exports now make up 20% of their sales.
